year in the New Victory Hall.




More Users and Activities Than Ever!

The new hall is proving to be a popular success as borne out by the big increase in the number of people using the building and the everincreasing range of activities available. In 2010 the new hall will welcome about 15,000 visitors, which is almost double the usage of the old hall.

The Youth Club and indoor bowls resume in September after the summer break. In addition to the wellestablished user groups, there is also now a weekly bridge

club and regular Dance & Meditation classes on certain Sundays. Tea Dances are proving popular with our older users and there is a steady increase in private and corporate hire of the hall, which bodes well for its financial sustainability.







How Green is our Heating?

We have been monitoring our electricity use since the hall opened to determine the effectiveness of our eco-friendly ground-source heat pump system—and it's brilliant!

It's difficult to directly compare energy used in the old vs. new halls but it appears that we are using roughly the same amount of energy to heat the NVH constantly as we did the old building intermittently. Given

that the new hall is very much larger, is always warm and has double the number of users this is a tremendous achievement and it shows just how effective the heating system and the straw bale insulation is.

For example, at the height of the February cold spell the electricity used in the hall each day was less than that consumed by a 3-bar electric fire running constantly. We bet that there are a

lot of householders who wish they could heat their own property as efficiently!

Turning our Mobile Gym into a Community Gym

The six month
trial period for

A Mobile Gym managed by North Norfolk District Council has been running at the NVH on Mondays from 10am - 2.45pm since April 2010. It has two qualified instructors who provide you with a personal programme to meet your specific needs and ensure you have a fun and safe exercise session. Cost £1.50 per session – great value! NNDC's long term aim is to help villages establish their own Community Gym with their own qualified instructors.

Our Mobile Gym trial funding ends later in

September and then, provided there is enough local support, NNDC will help the Gym users to set up a Community Gym and obtain a lottery grant to purchase their own gym equipment and fund the first year of operating.

This means the gym could run evening and weekend sessions and be available to those who can't make a day-time session.

The gym is a popular addition to the activities on offer at the hall and it would be wonderful if

we could continue and extend it. We currently have a fantastic one-off opportunity to make our weekly gym more permanent but it will only happen if enough users come forward to support the plan.

We need *your* support for the gym to continue, so please come along to a meeting on **Monday**13 September at

7.00pm in the NVH to find out more.

Improvements for Elderly & Disabled Users

Work will start soon on improving wheelchair access from the main road to the main entrance of the hall. Neatishead Parish Council has recently very kindly secured a grant of just over £2,000 from the

Lottery to help fund a new path around the edge of the gravel to make it easier for people and wheelchairs to reach the entrance. The work will be carried out by local volunteers on a date to be advised. If

The Trustees are also pleased to report that the hearing loop system in the main hall has been checked by the Royal Institute for the Deaf

and found to be functioning correctly. There is, however, a separate, intermittent, problem with the PA system and the Trustees are working with the installer to resolve this issue.
